Interested in changemaking? Want to be the leader of a student-led organisation? Run to be a Sabbatical Officer!

Cambridge SU aspires to be an empowering organisation which supports all students at the University of Cambridge. Our Sabbatical Officers are a huge part of this, especially with implementing their own experience into what they wish to campaign on. Being a Sabbatical Officer is a transformative experience. It's a chance to develop leadership skills, work with a diverse group of people, and gain experience that will serve you well in your future career.

This role is incredibly student facing, whether that's through communicating, running events, or lobbying for change across the student community. The work you do will affect not just your year, but future generations of students at Cambridge.

WHAT IS A SABBATICAL OFFICER?

Sabbatical Officers are an elected position within Cambridge SU. They are leaders of the SU, and only those who are current students can stand for election. The key remit of the role is to represent and campaign for students, ensuring their voices are heard across the collegiate university.

All Sabbatical Officers have a manifesto of campaigns they want to run or goals they want to achieve whilst in post. Sabbatical Officers also work on policies and campaigns which have been passed by students or previous Sabbatical Officers. They will then attend university meetings, meet with and talk to students to collect their views, run events and campaigns for students and lobby for change for the benefit of the student community. If you've enjoyed student life and want to give back to students, this is an excellent role to take on a full-time, paid position where every aspect of your role is working to improve students' lives!

JOB PURPOSE

As a Vice President of the SU, you will lead the political direction of the SU alongside the other Sabbatical Officers.

The Vice President (Education & Widening Participation) focuses on education and widening participation across the University. They will be the lead representative for students on issues surrounding their educational experience and the equal participation of all students in university life, including fair access to study at the university.

Should an undergraduate hold this position, the President (PG) will support ensuring postgraduate education is represented, and vice versa if the role-holder is a postgraduate.

You will also be a Trustee of the SU. The Board of Trustees are legally and financially responsible for Cambridge SU and its activities. The Board ensures that Cambridge SU remains legally compliant, financially stable and has robust future planning. You'll be putting into practice strategic leadership and planning skills, negotiation tactics, as well as gaining knowledge on financial oversight, plus much more, which will contribute to your professional development and career boosting opportunities.

OVERVIEW OF RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Be the lead representative of undergraduate students at the University of Cambridge;

2. Deliver on the commitments made in their election manifesto;
3. Serve as a Trustee of the SU.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Campaign for the rights and interests of students on an institutional, local, and national level;
2. Lead campaigns, projects, and/or events that relate to education and widening participation;
3. Represent the student body on a range of University committees, particularly on issues surrounding education and widening participation;
4. Represent the student body to local and national organisations, such as charities and MPs;
5. Seek student insight and feedback to inform campaigns and projects;
6. Build and strengthen relationships with student representatives, particularly Academic Reps, Access Officers, and Class Act Officers;
7. Participate in the SU's regular democratic meetings, including Student Council, Executive Committee, and Forums;
8. Undertake responsibilities determined by democratic student mandate, e.g. campaigning on student-led policies;
9. Publicise your work to students, through social media, blogs, or other means;
10. Serve as a Trustee of Cambridge SU, sharing ultimate responsibility for governing the charity and alongside the other Trustee Board members¹.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AS A STAFF MEMBER

1. Work collaboratively across Union departments and with your fellow Sabbatical Officers as an equal member of the team;
2. Contribute to organisational priorities and strategic plans;
3. Support organisation-wide projects and activities, such as Freshers' Fair;
4. Support or lead projects and activities where relevant, such as Reclaim the Night, Access-a-Ball, and the Alternative Prospectus;
5. Follow all SU policies and procedures in relation to your employment.

PREVIOUS EDUCATION & WIDENING PARTICIPATION ACHIEVEMENTS

- Launched the SUpermarket, providing free food for students in financial difficulties.
- Lobbied the University on workload reform for undergraduate students, which instigated the Teaching Review.
- Lobbied the University to introduce resits for final year undergraduate students who miss more than 25% of their final exams due to extenuating circumstances.
- Initiated and worked with the Postgraduate Admissions team to pass a paper which will allow postgraduate offer holders to defer their entry from 2026.
